BY THE HEADS OF GOVERNMENT OF THE MEMBER-STATES OF THE SHANGHAI COOPERATION ORGANIZATION

The unprecedented terrorist attacks committed on September 11, 2001 in the US that resulted in the deaths of thousands of innocent people, cause us the deepest indignation and resentment. We grieve together with the American people and extend our deepest and sincere condolences to the victims, families and friends of those killed in that tragedy.
